<b>Treaty Recognition Week</b>	Did you know that: Treaty rights are the specific rights embodied in the treaties that were entered into with the British government, and later Canada. Treaties often address the creation of reserves for the exclusive use of First Nations, and their rights to hunt, fish, and trap on provincial Crown lands. Treaty rights are protected by subsection 35(1) of the Constitution Act, 1982. The Barrie area, which has been home to different Indigenous groups over the years, is covered by Treaties 16 and 18.
